<b>Pazo Serantellos Albariño</b>	<b>Rias Baixas, Spain 2009</b>	<b>\$36</b>
The Albarino grape produces a vibrant, aromatic white wine with refreshing citrus.		
<b>Las Colinas Grenache Blanc</b>	<b>Catalunya, Spain, 2009</b>	<b>\$36</b>
Refreshingly crisp with white fruit flavors and no oak		
<b>Zoe Rosé</b>	<b>Greece 2009</b>	<b>\$38</b>
An amazing dry rosé with hints of rose petal and pomegranate		
<b>Skouras Moscofilero</b>	<b>Greece 2009</b>	<b>\$40</b>
This Greek white is similar to sauvignon blanc in style, showing citrus hints and crisp finish		
<b>Wolfgang Vinyards</b>	<b>Gruener-Veltliner, Austria 2009</b>	<b>\$42</b>
Austria's best loved white wine grape – Gruener -Veltliner – is similar to sauvignon blanc with a floral nose and crisp finish		
<b>Ceretto Arneis</b>	<b>Piedmont, Italy, 2008</b>	<b>\$46</b>
Flavorful and lively on the palate. Dry, and more aggressive than Pinot Grigio		
<b>Dr. Loosen Riesling</b>	<b>Mosel-Saar-Ruwer, Germany, 2008</b>	<b>\$42</b>
Very fruit forward Reisling. Great alternative to white Zinfandel		
<b>Argillae</b>	<b>Orvieto, Italy 2008</b>	<b>\$42</b>
The picturesque hill town of Orvieto produces this refreshing crisp, dry white wine		
<b>Rex Hill Chardonnay</b>	<b>Willamette Valley, OR, 2007</b>	<b>\$42</b>
Floral nose with dry body and no oak		
<b>Frenzy Sauvignon Blanc</b>	<b>Marlborough, New Zealand 2008</b>	<b>\$44</b>
A lively white with pink grapefruit and lemongrass hints		
<b>Hugel Gentil</b>	<b>Alsace, France 2008</b>	<b>\$44</b>
A blend of the noble white grapes of Alsace; a pleasingly aromatic and playful white with crisp finish		
<b>Qupé Bien Nacido Cuvée</b>	<b>Santa Maria Valley, CA, 2009</b>	<b>\$46</b>
Charming white Rhone-style blend of viognier and chardonnay. An un-oaked white with fleshy fruit and broad finish		
<b>Montoya Chardonnay</b>	<b>Monterey, CA 2008</b>	<b>\$46</b>
Lush with tropical fruit, hints of vanilla and oak		
<b>Napa Cellars Chardonnay</b>	<b>Napa, CA 2007</b>	<b>\$48</b>
Lush fruit and toasty oak round out this great chardonnay		
<b>Chateau Graille-Lacoste</b>	<b>Bordeaux, France 2009</b>	<b>\$50</b>
An attractive blend of Semillon and sauvignon blanc. Balanced fruit and elegant finish		
<b>Heitz Cellars Chardonnay</b>	<b>Napa, CA 2007</b>	<b>\$58</b>
Well-integrated fruit and oak round out this chardonnay		
<b>Abbazia Di Novacella Pinot Grigio</b>	<b>Alto Adige, Italy, 2009</b>	<b>\$61</b>
All that most pinot grigio try to strive for is in this wine. Deeply concentrated with flavor, this is a serious pinot grigio.		
<b>Neyers Chardonnay</b>	<b>Carneros, CA 2008</b>	<b>\$65</b>
Big style chardonnay with ripe carneros fruit, vanilla hints and oak finish		
<b>Louis Jadot Pouilly Fuisse</b>	<b>Burgundy, France, 2008</b>	<b>\$60</b>
This infamous French wine is elegant, medium bodied with no oak.		
<b>Broglia “La Meirana” Cortese Gavi, Italy, 2008</b>		<b>\$60</b>
With aromas of fall pear, this Italian grape “Cortese” is medium bodied, fruity yet dry on finish. A nice change from Pinot Grigio.		
<b>Ferrari Carano Reserve Chardonnay</b>	<b>Sonoma 2007</b>	<b>\$75</b>
This estate reserve wine is showing quite an abundance of intense chardonnay characteristics with big finish		
<b>Domaine Drouhin Chardonnay</b>	<b>Dundee Hills, Oregon 2007</b>	<b>\$75</b>
Oregon chardonnay produced in a French style that is dry with hints of mineral and limestone		
<b>Louis Latour Puligny-Montrachet</b>	<b>Burgundy, France 2006</b>	<b>\$98</b>
An assertive dry white burgundy with mineral hints and no oak on the finish		

## Sparkling & Dessert Wines

<b>Banfi Rosa Regale – “half bottle”</b>	<b>Italy, 2004</b>	<b>\$35</b>
Great for dessert, buttery sparkling red, hints of strawberry and raspberry		
<b>Marquis del al Tour</b>	<b>France</b>	<b>\$36</b>
A charming floral, yet dry Brut champagne		
<b>Veuve Cliquot</b>	<b>Champagne, France</b>	<b>\$96</b>
French-style Brut with slight yeast hints and lovely tiny bubbles		
<b>Fantinel Prosecco</b>	<b>Italy</b>	<b>\$44</b>
Aromatic bouquet, crisp, dry and elegant
